Old Business: Discussion of cameras and the current bid from the same company that installed our previous cameras. There would be a change out of the one in the main hall to a 360-degree camera. A 360-degree camera in the wellness center/unready room, outside corner by the commissioners office, one by the front apron and one in the stairwell.

-Mike working on estimate for grant on sheriff's office, donated a camera to help offset costs. Just incase grant takes a long time.

-Commissioner Duvall reminded the board that outside contractors would have access to logins. And it would be outside viewing only.

-Cameras are motion activated now.

-Department did not want cameras in ready room.

-Commissioner Duvall makes a motion to accept. 1st quote plus \$1,000 to finish out and protect the building inside and out. Seconded by Commissioner Rhoda.

Chairperson Heissenberger opens the floor for discussion.

-Commissioner Duvall let the board know approval from state to just use this quote as we are already working with the licensed company.

-Chairperson Heissenberger has changed his mind and agrees to have cameras installed to protect our members. With the incident in Buffalo and the neighbor in the back property he is doing all he can to protect the members.

-Past chief Derrick Legters wanted to know more about the camera specifics. He was given the quote to look over. He shared with the board his dislike of the idea of cameras in the ready room and wellness center. Added he thinks members will not want to come.

-Commissioner Duvall let the board know the town view is negative about the department and district and the potential need to purchase a new truck and in general how money is spent.

-Commissioner Legters reminded him that the meetings are public, and anyone has been welcomed to join and still no one comes to express their opinions.

-Past Chief Derrick Legters stated a wedge will be created amongst the department members and the district.

-Chief mentioned during review process for approval on the wellness center cameras were not mentioned.

-Commissioner Duvall reminding the room there is a motion on the floor and to end back and forth.

Chairperson Heissenberger ended discussion and Secretary Barbaro read the motion again to the board of Commissioner Duvall made a motion to approve 1st quote with an additional \$1000 to approve the quote and install cameras inside and out.
